Programmed Intermittent Epidural Boluses (PIEB) - A Superior Method for Labor Analgesia

In this presentation John Gianitsis, MSNA, CRNA will discuss the different ways of managing a labor epidural. Including: manual, continuous infusions, continuous infusions + patient controlled epidural analgesia & programmed intermittent epidural boluses (PIEB). John will then discuss why the trend is moving towards PIEB and finally he will show how PIEB is superior to all of the other methods of dosing a labor epidural.

Coronavirus Part II: Managing the Critical Ill Patient in Anesthesia Updated

As the global COVID-19 pandemic exceeds 22 million cases, 25% of those cases reside in the United States. Total deaths in the United States now equals 170,000+ cases after the 2nd surge. Many healthcare providers on the frontline are becoming infected with the virus, with some dying. There are many unknowns and postulations in managing a COVID-19 case. One area of main concern includes the profound inflammatory response on the pulmonary system. This updated topic will focus on some of the current strategies managing the intubate COVID-19 patient, including learned effects of care.
